The Center for Innovation in Teaching and Learning will provide workshops on “strategies, challenges and opportunities for online and remote education” with Teaching and Learning Specialists Lucas Anderson and David Favre, PhD. Professor Suzanne Franks will provide a lecture/workshop on using breakout room techniques on Zoom for peer collaboration, peer-assessment, and self-assessment.

Panel discussion with Korean-American undergraduate and graduate students: KNU students will have opportunities to draft questions to ask guest speakers from the above diverse areas, based on their reading of short articles, and have opportunities to ask and discuss various issues related to linguistic/cultural diversity in the US and beyond.
